REFLECTION

From our modern perspective, the Ascension is one of the weirder events in Christ's life. On a surface level, it is kind of odd. Depictions of the event in art are even more bizarre. Some paintings and statues of the Ascension of our Lord are downright hilarious, showing only the feet of Jesus as he rises to heaven. But the very strangeness of this event can pull us out of our usual way of looking at the world and remind us that in Jesus everything has changed. At Christmas, we celebrate God joining us in our humanity. With the Ascension, God in Christ takes that humanity back to God. Jesus does not return to where he came from on his own. God in Christ did not descend and take on humanity simply to be with us- as extraordinarily world-altering as that act is – but to drag us back up with him into the very heart of God so that we might dwell there forever.
